Owners: your responsibilities

Report an incident:

- flooding
- blockages
- pollution
- unusual changes to flow of water
- collapsed or badly damaged banks

Owners: your responsibilities

- Let water flow naturally
- Prevent pollution
- Protect wildlife
- Maintain bed and banks







Manage flood risk: rules and responsibilities

- Main rivers
- Other watercourses
- If the tide affects your watercourse
- Culverts
- Planning permission
- Landowner permission
- Removing water, building or altering a dam or weir
- Protected areas and species
