- An event or situation which threatens serious damage to human welfare in a place in the UK, an event or situation which threatens serious damage to the environment of a place in the United Kingdom or war, or terrorism which threatens serious damage to the security of the United Kingdom.

Category 1 Duties:

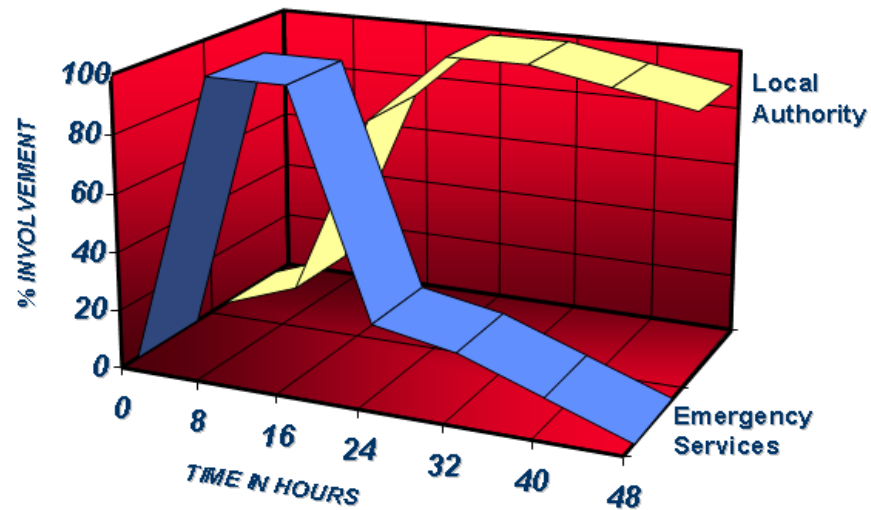
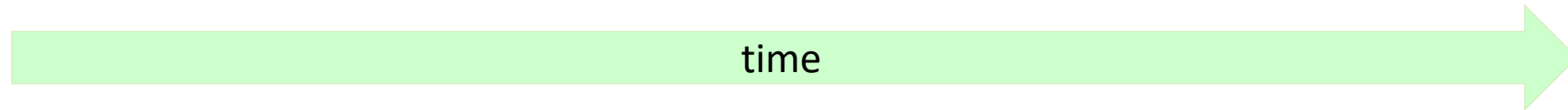
1. Assess the risk of emergencies occurring and use this to inform contingency planning. This is collated at the local level to form a community risk register
2. Put in place emergency plans
3. Put in place arrangements to make information available to the public about civil protection matters and maintain arrangements to warn, inform and advise the public in the event of an emergency
4. Share information with other local responders to enhance co-ordination.
5. Co- operate with other local responders, through Local Resilience Forum, to enhance co-ordination and efficiency
6. Put in place business continuity arrangements
7. Provide advice and assistance to businesses and voluntary organisations about business continuity management.
