The Board takes a strategic overview of the organisation and provides guidance to our staff team, which handles the day-to-day operational management of the organisation and service delivery. Our new Treasurer will play a key strategic role in shaping the financial future of our charity.

### What will be required of the Treasurer?

Our new Treasurer will be required to attend quarterly Board and Finance & Personnel Committee meetings; attend occasional strategic planning days; and engage with key Board members and senior staff outside of these meetings.

Your time commitment will be around one day per month and the position is voluntary, although you will be able to claim expenses.

#### What will you get out of it?

Our new Treasurer will benefit from valuable new skills and experience in charity governance and finances, as well as the opportunity to meet and network with new people, including our expert staff team. We provide opportunities for Trustees to join staff outings, public events, working groups and team meetings if they wish to, and provide regular trustee communications so you can feel part of our team.

Above all, you will be providing valuable guidance to help DCT support communities all over Devon, helping us create positive change for thousands of people.
