The award will be presented to the group which has, in the Judges estimation following a visit to the shortlisted candidates, made the most outstanding contribution to improving the lives of their community. The Award carries with it a framed certificate and a cash prize of £1,000 from His Royal Highness the Prince of Wales, which the winning group must use to further their community initiatives.

RULES OF THE COMPETITION

- 1. Open to organisations in Devon only.
- 2. The information supplied will not be divulged as per GDPR.
- 3. Preliminary selection will be made using the information supplied by the competitor.
- 4. The selected competitors will be informed during the second week of April 2019.
- 5. The judges will visit the short listed entrants during the fourth week of April 2019.
- 6. The panel of judges will consider the general criteria using the information supplied in conjunction with their visit. Judges will be from The Duchy of Cornwall and the DCAA
- 7. The presentation of the Award to the winner of the competition will be made at the Devon County Show on Friday 17th May 2019.
