How does it work?

- The objective would be for students to complete 315 hours, though the preference would be for 350hrs, if possible.
- IPs would run on a weekly, day-release basis, throughout the second and third term of this academic year.
- IPs would begin in January 2021, ending by no later than 2nd July 2021.
- A Pre-Placement Agreement would be signed prior to the start of an IP, which includes:
 - IP student expectations, commitments, timings and duration, etc.
 - The role of Exeter College
 - Agreed aims and objectives
- You will be supported throughout the IP by a designated Industry Placement Liaison Officer (IPLO) who will support key parties and administer all end-to-end aspects of the IP; with the IPLO carrying out IP visits every 6-10 weeks, for quality assurance purposes and to resolve any issue that may arise.
- For an IP to go ahead, the college will complete a Health and Safety Checklist and you will be informed of the College's Safeguarding Policies and Procedures.

Benefits

- An IP is a perfect opportunity to develop human capital and as a talent stream to your business.
- A golden opportunity to measure a student's performance prior to offering potential Apprenticeships, Traineeships or employment.
- Students will arrive with a good level of knowledge and skills, as well as being eager and committed add immediate value whilst developing significant skills throughout an IP.
- Your employees will have the opportunity to develop their own mentoring and leadership skills
- You will become an IP flagship employer of the future, bringing tangible benefit to the local, regional and wider economy.

- The IP must give the student relevant opportunities to develop their technical and soft skills.
